

Notes on Common Errors 2972 – 3023

(Error incidence : total error : total entry)

- 2975 NSNARES for (E)NSNARLS (20 : 38 : 335)
Two poles beset by knots, we've heard, and tangles
S, N in NARLS (cf. GNARLS/KNARLS)
- 2979 INDITE for ENDITE (in hieroglyphs) (98 : 120 : 177)
Write, invite, or cite? Any will do
3 meanings and all 'end i-t-e'
- 2983 PROVABLY for PROBABLY (16 : 85 : 289)
Test endlessly with skill indicating the likely outcome
PROB(E) + ABLY; PROV(E) + ABLY fits the cryptic indication but lacks the precise definition required
- 2984 (i) SILENIC for SELENIC (21 : 124 : 401)
Eerie silence of the moon
Anag. silence
- (ii) DESAPIENT for DESIPIENT (18 : 124 : 401)
Playing the fool, one with pie tends to get messy
Anag. I + PIE TENDS (DESAPIENT non-existent)
- (iii) ANIMALCULA for ANIMALCULE (15 : 124 : 401)
Little creature making French excited about a cruel cull
A + anag. CULL in ANIMÉ
- 2985 RECLEANING for RECLEARING (18 : 32 : 259)
'A cold coming...'? I recall || having to make the journey long ago gripped by -32 Fahrenheit
GLACIER (theme-word, hidden jumble in redundant expression)
+ REN (old word for run, hidden) make RECLEARING
- 2986 Diverted rivers/original courses incorrectly treated (54 : 57 : 155)
- 2988 ROOD for ROOS (30 : 62 : 344)
This word b | emeans a race across the border
Printer's Devilry; ...BROOSE...
...BROO DEMEANS... does not make the required sense
- 2990 (i) Odd single letter not altered (28 : 72 : 210)
(ii) Multiple letters not altered (23 : 72 : 210)
"Letters of answers should always be changed..."
i.e. **a** to **c**, **n** to **h**, etc.

- 2991 UCMEKL (MUCKLE) for ICMEKL (MICKLE) (31 : 57 : 327)
Bull (50) at end of game much out of fashion
 MICK + L + (gam)E (MUCK ? BULL)
- 2992 TAI for TWI (33 : 61 : 288)
Double Dutch? No, another language
 2 meanings
- 2995 PHILLIPA for PHILIPPA (14 : 20 : 240)
Girl involved haplessly in pileup without Nelly sues
 Anag. HAPLESSLY IN PILEUP less letters of NELLY SUES
- 2996 CLOT for COOT (110 : 117 : 216)
Wit [misprint, nit] with varied collection of books
 CO- (prefix, = with) + O.T.
- 2998 ABLE for AXLE (24 : 42 : 271)
Support festival by going in
 X [= (multiplied) by] in ALE
- 3000 ROTTER for ROTTAN (in Froghop section) (66 : 89(116) : 210)
 Cryptic from: ...*time to put horse out*
 T (time), T (to) in ROAN
 Definition RAT at appropriate location clue
- 3001 ATENER for (ERG)ATANER (16 : 29 : 265)
Male worker, a fantastic earner around the local street mostly
 GAT(e) in anag. EARNER
- 3003 AREOLA for AREOLE (28 : 49 : 232)
Real crazy about the old game – getting ring round point
 E O in anag. REAL
- 3009 Outlet pipe attribution faulty (16 : 30 : 179)
- 3010 RIMA for RIVA (30 : 31 : 170)
 RIMA fitted the definition (cleft) but was not a “letter mixture” as specified, appearing normally in ‘primal’
- 3013 Whole diagram encoded, not specified as a requirement (36 : 75 : 333)
- 3015 Various alternatives to ‘1’ in square (43 : 62 : 288)
 ‘And the fire and the rose are one’ allowed all of ROSEWATER,
 FIRE-WATER, ROSE-BUG and FIREBUG to be entered consistently
- 3019 Message under diagram faulty (15 : 42 : 259)

- 3020 (i) Indicative word (NASIK) and/or }
 (ii) central factor (167) faulty } (27 : 28 : 77)
- 3023 (i) COSKTER for CORKTER (16 : 45 : 173)
I may sell wares at best or keenest prices (a sort of Tesco by the road's edge?)
 Anag. TESCO + R(oad) ? COSTER, S to RK
- (ii) LTO for LTT (14 : 45 : 173)
Pot is short one, making whole set
 LOT(a), O T is
