4 <i>Everest</i>	The highest of the 4 “Seven Summits” in ascending order (highest peaks in 4 Asia, 3 S America, 2 N America official name now of McKinley, changed in 2015), 1 Africa
5 <i>verdo 2</i>	“Transposed” destinations of A roads from London (Holyhead (A5), Avonmouth (A4), Portsmouth (A3), Dover (A2))
6 <i>Erato, Clio</i>	The Muses in descending order of name length
7 <i>Raiders of the Lost Ark</i>	Indiana Jones film franchise in reverse order
8 <i>“A” is for Alibi</i>	Sue Grafton’s Kinsey Millhone series, in reverse order
9 <i>(an) isosceles triangle</i>	Shapes of 6-5-4-3 sides with only one line of symmetry
10 <i>SONTSONT</i>	Forms (in pairs) of the French verb <i>être</i>

- 14 In the title of the double-platinum certified UK No1 single of 1997, *what* (fairly predictably) do “Teletubbies say...”?**
- 15 Which Desmond forms an unusual academic quartet with an England World Cup-winning striker, a Hunnish leader and a lieutenant of Thatcher and Major?**
